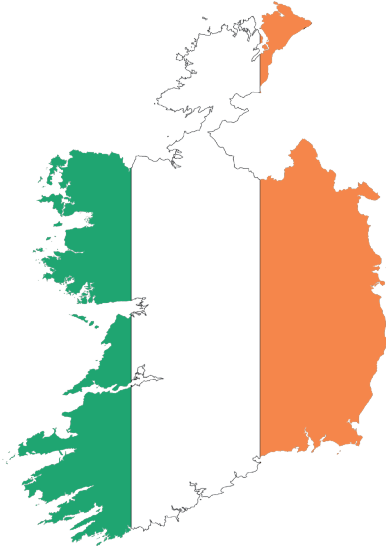

- Ireland is called Éire in Irish and is also known as the Republic of Ireland.
- Ireland covers five-sixths of the island of the same name, the remaining one-sixth of the island is Northern Ireland, which is part of the United Kingdom.
- Irish, or Irish Gaelic is the country's first official language, however the second official language English is more commonly spoken.
- There are over 4.75 million people living in Ireland as of July 2013.
- The Irish capital, Dublin is home to over one quarter of the total population.
- Saint Patrick's Day, the 17th of March, is Ireland's official national holiday. On St. Patrick's Day, Irish families traditionally attended church in the morning and celebrated St. Patrick's Day in the afternoon. The holiday is celebrated

in Ireland and many other countries around the world.

- Shamrock is the national symbol of Ireland.
- Irish writers have made major contributions to world literature. Famous writers include Jonathan Swift (*Gulliver's Travels*), George Bernard Shaw (*Pygmalion*) and James Joyce (*Ulysses*).
- Ireland has won the Eurovision Song Contest a record seven times.
- A number of multinational technology corporations have their headquarters in Ireland, which makes Ireland one of the largest exporters of hardware and software-related goods and services in the world.
- The world famous Guinness beer is from Ireland. It originated in the Dublin brewery of Arthur Guinness.
- Ireland was one of the initial 12 European Union nations that began using the euro currency in 2002.
- Gaelic football and hurling are traditional sports of Ireland and remain the most popular sports in the country. Hurling is considered to be the world's fastest field sport.
- At the Olympics, boxing is Ireland's most successful sport.

THROUGH MALALA'S EYES



Malala Yousafzai, 18, has become an international symbol for peace. When she was just 11 years old, she started blogging about the Taliban—a group who follows an extreme version of Islam, and believes young girls should not go to school. Malala courageously spoke out against the group and said all children—especially girls—have the right to an education.

When she was 15, the Taliban tried to silence her. A gunman boarded Malala's school bus in Pakistan's Swat Valley and shot her in the head. Malala survived and showed great optimism during her long recovery. For her activism, Malala was awarded the 2014 Nobel Peace Prize and became the youngest Nobel winner in history.

DAVIS GUGGENHEIM: I have two daughters—a 3rd grader and a 9th grader—and I really made the movie for them. My dream was that girls everywhere, in every country, feel like this is their story.

GUGGENHEIM: The producers—Laurie MacDonald and Walter F. Parkes—bought the rights to Malala’s book, *I Am Malala*, and they were going to make a Hollywood movie with actors. But, when they met Malala and her family, they said they are so amazing, so real, so funny, and so inspiring that it has to be a documentary.

TFK: “We Stand With Malala” has become a popular slogan. What does it mean?

GUGGENHEIM: There are 66 million girls out of school because either the culture says they can’t go to school or the country doesn’t want to pay for it or other reasons. Now, Malala represents all of these kids. She has a growing army of followers and kids from all around the world who say “We Stand With Malala.”
