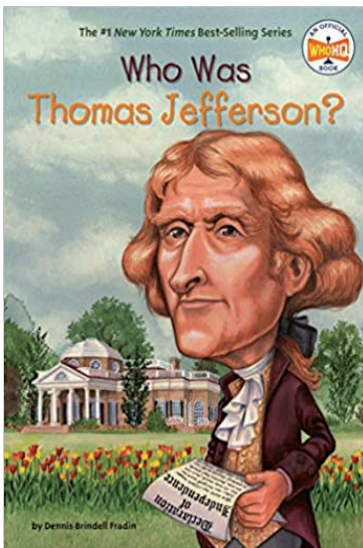

### THE BOTTOM LINE

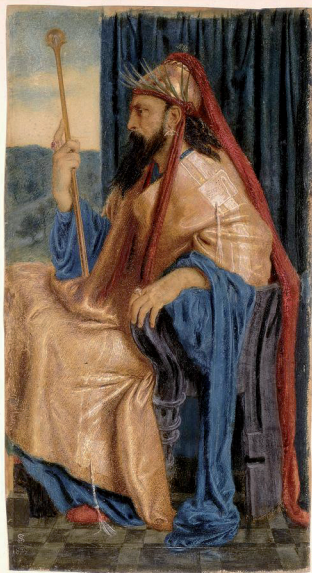
Even mild dehydration can affect you mentally and physically. Make sure that you get enough water each day. It's one of the best things you can do for your overall health.
