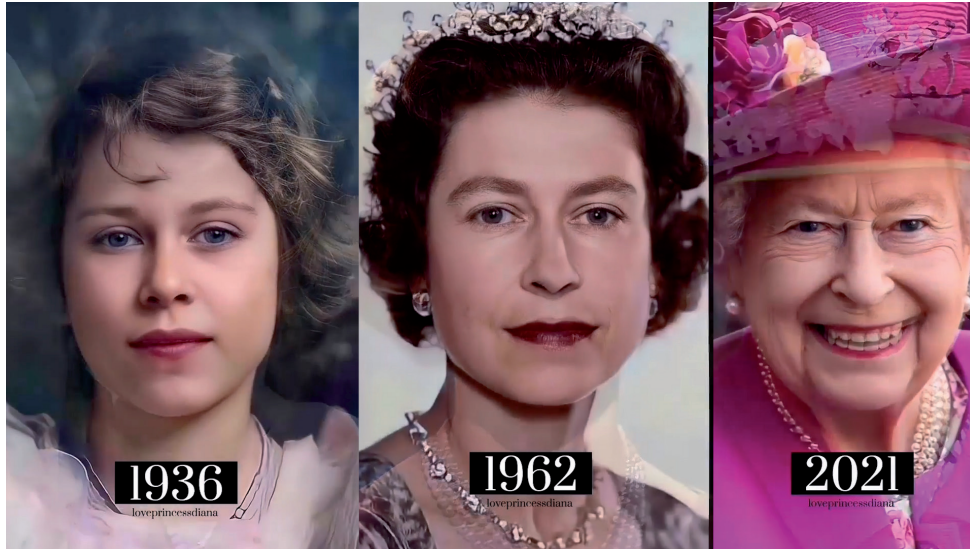

A SHORT BIOGRAPHY OF QUEEN ELIZABETH II



1. _____

Elizabeth was born on 21 April 1926 to the Duke and Duchess of York. The Duke was the second son of King George V. His brother Edward, the Prince of Wales, was heir to the throne, so the Duke lived a quiet, simple life. He taught Elizabeth the value of money, giving her only five pence a week.

2. _____

In 1937 Elizabeth's whole life changed when King George V died. Her uncle Edward became King Edward VII, but he gave up the crown eleven months later. Suddenly, her father was king (George VI) and Elizabeth was next in line for the throne.

3. _____

Two years later, The Second World War started. Elizabeth's mother insisted the family stayed at home in solidarity with other Londoners. Elizabeth and her younger sister, Margaret, put on pantomimes for troops and friends at Windsor Castle. She even trained to be a driver in the army.

4. _____

In 1952, when Elizabeth was only 25 years old, her beloved father died and she was crowned Queen Elizabeth II. Her coronation was the world's first major event to be televised and millions across the globe watched it.

5. _____

Elizabeth married Greek Prince Philip Mountbatten in 1947. The Queen's role in the world and in the UK was very different from how monarchs ruled in the past. Her reign was more symbolic and she was not allowed to express opinions on how the country was run.

6. _____

Things didn't always run smoothly. Three of her children Charles, Anne and Andrew, all went through divorces. In 1992 a fire caused terrible damage at Windsor Castle. Other tragedies, such as the death of Princess Diana, Charles's ex-wife, didn't make life any easier.

Queen Elizabeth and her family got through all their troubles. She went on to celebrate her Diamond Jubilee in 2012. In 2022 Queen Elizabeth II celebrated the Platinum Jubilee, spending seventy years on the throne – beating Queen Victoria, who was Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland for sixty three years.
